Preparatory Prayer

Presider invites the people to a moment of silent prayer to prepare for the day's service.

Presider says one of the following

Send out your light and your truth, that they may lead me, and bring me to your holy hill and to your dwelling. *Psalm 43:3*

Opening Song

Confession of Sin

The presider says

Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

Presider and People together

Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your name. Amen.

The presider says

Almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us all our sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen us in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep us in eternal life. *Amen.*

Responsorial Psalm

Presider Let us stand and read the Psalm responsively.

Psalm 96:1-9

¹ Oh, sing to the LORD a new song!

Sing to the LORD, all the earth.

² Sing to the LORD, bless His name;

Proclaim the good news of His salvation from day to day.

³ Declare His glory among the nations,
His wonders among all peoples.

⁴ For the LORD *is* great and greatly to be praised;
He *is* to be feared above all gods.

⁵ For all the gods of the peoples *are* idols,
But the LORD made the heavens.

⁶ Honor and majesty *are* before Him;
Strength and beauty *are* in His sanctuary.

⁷ Give to the LORD, O families of the peoples,
Give to the LORD glory and strength.

⁸ Give to the LORD the glory *due* His name;
Bring an offering, and come into His courts.

⁹ Oh, worship the LORD in the beauty of holiness!
Tremble before Him, all the earth.

All say

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; as it was in the beginning,
is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

V: Grant that every member of the Church may truly and humbly serve you;

R: That your Name may be glorified by all people.

V: We pray for all bishops, priests, and deacons;

R: That they may be faithful ministers of your Word and Sacraments.

V: We pray for all who govern and hold authority in the nations of the world;

R: That there may be justice and peace on the earth.

V: Give us grace to do your will in all that we undertake;

R: That our works may find favor in your sight.

V: Have compassion on those who suffer from any grief or trouble;

R: That they may be delivered from their distress.

V: We praise you for your saints who have entered into joy;

R: May we also come to share in your heavenly kingdom.

V. Let us now pray for our own needs and those of others.

Moment of Silence

Presider closes with the following collect

O Lord our God, accept the fervent prayers of your people; in the multitude of your mercies, look with compassion upon us and all who turn to you for help; for you are gracious, O lover of souls, and to you we give glory, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, now and for ever. *Amen.*

Prayer for Missions

All together

Almighty and everlasting God, by whose Spirit the whole body of your faithful people is governed and sanctified: Receive our prayers for all members of your holy Church, that in their vocation and ministry they may truly serve you; through our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. *Amen.*

Closing Prayer

Prayer of St. Chrysostom

Almighty God, you have given us grace at this time with one accord to make our common supplication to you; and you have promised through your well-beloved Son that when two or three are gathered together in his Name you will be in the midst of them: Fulfill now, O Lord, our desires and petitions as may be best for us; granting us in this world knowledge of your truth, and in the age to come life everlasting. Amen.

People Thanks be to God.

3. To him who by means of his power working in us is able to do so much more than we can ever ask for or even think of: to God be the glory in the church and in Christ Jesus for all time, for ever and ever. Amen. (Eph. 3:20-21)
