ASH WEDNESDAY SERVICE (March 5, 2025)

PRELUDE

INVITATION

Beloved in the Lord: We are now gathered for our Ash Wednesday Service and, together, let us mark the beginning of the Lenten Season in our church calendar. Every year we celebrate our Christian Passover through the life, death, and resurrection of Christ. Lent is a time provided by the Church, which from ancient times was a period for the preparation of candidates for baptism. It is also a period for the whole Church to prepare for this celebration through repentance and renewal of faith, and receiving the mercy and forgiveness of God.

We begin our journey to Easter with the sign of ashes, an ancient sign, speaking of the frailty and uncertainty of human life, and marking the penitence of the community as a whole. Let us therefore observe a holy Lent by self-examination, penitence, prayer, fasting and almsgiving, and by reading and meditating on the Word of God.

Officiant: Blessed are You, Lord our God, King of the Universe: You love Your people, and have given us the words of eternal life.

People: O Lord, the God of our salvation: Your Word is the light of our lives, and the

lantern of our feet. Teach us and lead us with the light of Your eternal Word.

Officiant: Please be **SEATED** to hear from the Word of God.

OT: Isaiah 58:1-12

Epistle: 2 Corinthians 5:20-6:10

After each Reading, the Reader may say The word of the Lord.

SERMON (The Rt. Rev. James Boliget)

THE BLESSING AND IMPOSITION OF ASHES

Officiant

We will now have the sign, this reminder, the imposition of ashes. The ashes on our foreheads serve as reminders for us that we are mere dust and that we are wholly dependent on the grace of God, our Creator and redeemer, for our life and salvation. Let us kneel.

The Officiant with the Bishop prepares the ashes on the altar.

Officiant: The Lord be with you. People: And also with you.

Officiant: Let us pray.

The BISHOP if present, declares the ff:

Almighty and eternal God: You made us from the dust of the earth and breathed into us the gift of life. You gave us freedom of will, that we might offer to You our love and service. When we turned away from You and sinned, in righteous judgment You decreed, that we should return to that dust from which You formed us. Yet, O merciful Father, You did not abandon us to death, but in Your compassion sent Jesus Christ to save us. He took our mortal nature

and bore our shame; He went down into the dust for our salvation. From the dust You raised Him again to life, the first fruit and the pledge of a new and redeemed creation.

We pray that our observation of Ash Wednesday would remind us of our mortality and of Your judgment on our sins, and for our resolve to turn to You in true repentance; that in this time of Lent we may be purified and renewed, and rise to newness of life through the power of the resurrection of Your Son our Savior Jesus Christ. Amen.

Almighty God, You have created us out of the dust of the earth: Grant that these ashes may be to us a sign of our mortality and penitence, that we may remember that it is only by Your gracious gift that we are given everlasting life; through Jesus Christ our Savior. *Amen*.

The People will be seated first. The Officiant gives instructions for the People.

The priest imposes on himself the ash and signs everyone with the cross saying, Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM (The People KNEEL.)

Psalm 51

¹Have mercy upon me, O God, According to Your lovingkindness; According to the multitude of Your tender mercies, Blot out my transgressions.

² Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, And cleanse me from my sin.

LITANY OF PENITENCE

The Officiant and People say together

Most holy and merciful Father, we confess to You, to one another, and to the whole community of saints in heaven and on earth, that we have sinned by our own fault in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone.

- V We have not loved You with our whole heart, and mind and strength. We have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We have not forgiven others, as we have been forgiven.
- R Have mercy on us, Lord.
- V We have been deaf to Your call to serve as Christ served us. We have not been true disciples of Christ. We have grieved Your Holy Spirit.
- R Have mercy on us, Lord.

- V We confess to You, Lord, all our past unfaithfulness: the pride, hypocrisy, and impatience of our lives.
- R We confess to You, Lord.
- V Our self-indulgent appetites and ways, and our exploitation of other people.
- R We confess to You, Lord.
- V Our anger at our own frustration, and our envy of those more fortunate than others.
- R We confess to You, Lord.
- V Our intemperate love of worldly goods and comforts, and our dishonesty in daily life and work.
- R We confess to You, Lord.
- V Our negligence in prayer and worship, and our failure to commend the faith that is in us.
- R We confess to You, Lord.
- V Accept our repentance, Lord, for the wrongs we have done: for our blindness to human need and suffering, and our indifference to injustice and cruelty.
- R Accept our repentance, Lord.
- V For all false judgments, for uncharitable thoughts towards our neighbors and for our prejudice and contempt toward those who differ from us.
- R Accept our repentance, Lord.
- V For our waste and pollution of creation, and our lack of concern for those who come after us.
- R Accept our repentance, Lord.
- V Restore us, good Lord, and let Your anger depart from us;
- R Hear us, Lord, for Your mercy is great.
- V Accomplish in us the work of Your salvation
- R That we may show forth Your glory in the world.

- V By the life and death of Your Son our Lord,
- R Bring us with all Your saints to the joy of His resurrection.

The BISHOP, if present, or the Priest, stands and, facing the people, says

Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who desires not the death of sinners, but rather that they may turn from their wickedness and live, has given power and commandment to His ministers to declare and pronounce to His people, being penitent, the absolution and remission of their sins. He pardons and absolves all those who truly repent, and with sincere hearts believe His holy Gospel.

Therefore, we beseech Him to grant us true repentance and His Holy Spirit, that those things may please Him which we do on this day, and that the rest of our life hereafter may be pure and holy, so that at the last we may come to His eternal joy; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*.
