The Liturgy of the Word

The Collect

Rector or Priest

Almighty God, we pray You graciously to behold this Your family, for whom our Lord Jesus Christ was willing to be betrayed, and given into the hands of sinners, and to suffer death upon the cross; who now lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. *Amen.*

The ministers proceed to their places.

People stand for the prayer.

Officiant Is it nothing to you all, you who pass by?

People Look and see if there is any sorrow like my sorrow which was brought upon me.

V: They seek after the life of the righteous man;

R: And condemn the innocent one.

V: They divide my clothing among them.

R: And cast lot for my robe.

V: With cruel blows they pierced my hands and feet,

R: Nailing me to the wood of the cross.

V: They gave me gall to eat,

R: And when I was thirsty, they gave me vinegar to drink.

V: I am counted among those who go down to the Pit,

R: And my life draws near the grave.

V: All we like sheep have gone astray, we have turned, every one to his own way;

R: And the Lord has laid on Him the iniquity of us all.

Officiant O God, the Father of all humankind,

You allowed Your only Son, Jesus Christ,

to be made a spectacle to the mob

to be mocked and beaten,

to be nailed to the painful cross;

and by this humiliation You revealed His majesty and power.

Make us, we pray, both to behold the Man

and to worship the King,

and to give Him all our hearts' adoration,

even the same, Your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

V: Savior of the world, who by Your cross and precious blood have redeemed us;
R: Save us and help us, we humbly entreat You O Lord.

Rector

We pray, therefore, for people everywhere according to their needs.

The Rector faces the altar.

Officiant Let us pray for the holy catholic Church of Christ throughout the world;

For its unity in witness and service
For all bishops and other ministers and the people whom they serve
For our Diocesan Bishop, Rex, our Bishop-Elect, James, and the people of this diocese
For all Christians in this community
For those about to be baptized

That God will confirm His Church in faith, increase it in love, and preserve it in peace.

Silence

Officiant Let us pray for all nations and peoples of the earth, and for those in authority among them;

For the Republic of the Philippines, our President, and all who serve us in public office
For the Members and Representatives of the United Nations
For all who serve the common good

That by God's help they may seek justice and truth, and live in peace and concord.

Silence

Officiant Let us pray for all who suffer and are afflicted in body or in mind;

For the hungry and the homeless, the destitute, and the oppressed
For the sick, the wounded, and the crippled
For those in loneliness, fear, and anguish
For those who face temptation, doubt, and despair
For the sorrowful and bereaved
For prisoners and captives, and those in mortal danger

That God in His mercy will comfort and relieve them, and grant them the knowledge of His love, and stir up in us the will and patience to minister to their needs.

Silence

Officiant Let us pray for all who have not received the Gospel of Christ;

For those who have never heard the word of salvation
For those who have lost their faith
For those hardened by sin or indifference
For the contemptuous and the scornful
For those who are enemies of the cross of Christ and persecutors of His disciples
For those who in the name of Christ have persecuted others

That God will open their hearts to the truth, and lead them to faith and obedience.

Officiant

Let us commit ourselves to God, and pray for the grace of a holy life, that, with all who have departed this world and have died in the peace of Christ, and those whose faith is known to God alone, we may be accounted worthy to enter into the fullness of the joy of our Lord, and receive the crown of life in the day of resurrection.

Rector

O God of unchangeable power and eternal light: Look favorably on Your whole Church, that wonderful and sacred mystery; by the effectual working of Your providence, carry out in tranquility the plan of salvation; let the whole world see and know that things which were cast down are being raised up, and things which had grown old are being made new, and that all things are being brought to their perfection by Him through whom all things were made, Your Son Jesus Christ our Lord; who lives and reigns with You, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen.*

Behold the Cross of Christ on which the Savior of the World was hanged.
People O come, let us adore Him.

The Crucifer then places the Cross on its stand outside the Chancel.

Officiant O Savior of the world, who by Your cross and precious blood has redeemed us:

People Save us and help us, we humbly beseech You, O Lord.

Officiant We adore You, O Christ and we bless You.

People Because by Your holy cross You have redeemed the world.

V: If we die with Him, we shall also live with Him; if we endure, we shall also reign with Him.

R: We adore You, O Christ, and we bless You because by Your holy cross You have redeemed the world.

V: Christ, for us, became obedient to death

R: Even death on a cross.

Ministers and People

Wherefore God has highly exalted Him and given Him the name which is above every name; that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord.
